

Did you know...

- In 2009/2010 United Way secured \$30,000 for the Winter Warmth Program. This program, through Enbridge Gas and Hydro One, is helping to keep more than 150 families in their homes. The United Way has been operating the Winter Warmth Program since 2005.
- United Way participates at the following community tables: Poverty Coalition, Affordable Housing, Safe Communities Leadership Table, Children's Services Council, and Interagency Meetings for funded agencies.
- Three "Day of Caring" events have been held. The first had TD bank employees painting the back porch of the Red Cross building. During the second, RBC Lindsay branch employees assisted in creating a tactile backyard makeover at a residential home of Community Living. The latter event was organized by a young man, a landscaper and home renovator. The last Day of Caring, a basketball court, was completed in the fall of 2009, spearheaded by local youth, the Optimist Club, Kawartha Lakes Police Services and the Social Services Department for the City of Kawartha Lakes. The three Days of Caring relied on more than 35 business partnerships.
- \$36,000 in bursaries has been given to students graduating from high school who demonstrate leadership through volunteerism. Four bursaries of \$1,000 each are given to a student at St. Thomas Aquinas Secondary School, Lindsay Collegiate and Vocational Institute, I.E. Weldon Secondary School and Fenelon Falls Secondary School. The bursaries have been awarded every year since 2002 thanks to the generosity of an endowment plan.
